# 1. The Campaign in a nutshell – Goals

## Goals

- **Ensuring water safety and security** by tackling major water-related challenges like droughts, floods, and unpredictable water availability.
- **Promoting interdisciplinary research** by pooling expertise and infrastructure across the entire Helmholtz Association.
- **Fostering application-oriented innovation** through early stakeholder integration and a “transfer by design” approach.



# 1. The Campaign in a nutshell – Structure

## Structure

### 1. SOLUTION LAB PROPOSALS (1st Call)

- Establishment of three physical Solution Labs serving as hubs for the thematic projects:

**Solution Labs: SOLVE (Elbe) | SLRE (Rur Erft) | URBAN LE (Leipzig)**

### 2. Theme Proposals (2nd Call)

- Selection of three theme projects (each consisting of up to six sub-projects) for implementation at one of the previously selected Solution Labs



# 1. The Campaign in a nutshell – Funding

## Funding

- Total Budget: €9 Million from the Helmholtz Initiative and Networking Fund (IVF)
  - Plus at least 25 % Co-Funding by Helmholtz Centers per proposal
  - Each Solution Lab is allocated €100,000 p.a. for a coordination position
  - The remaining funding budget of approximately €8.1 million will be allocated among the theme projects by an international expert panel
- Funding duration: 3 years within the period 2026 – 2028
- Eligible costs include personnel costs, materials and investments

## 2. Theme Proposals (2<sup>nd</sup> Call) – Key Criteria

### Key criteria

- **Thematic fit:** Terrestrial Water Cycles, Urban Water Systems, or Water Quality
- **Consortium:** Min. 3 Helmholtz Centers, min. 2 research fields
- **Solution Lab link:** Strong integration with one of the three Solution Labs
- **Transfer by design/co-creation:** Stakeholder integration
- **Clear milestones**

### Evaluation

- An international panel of experts will review the proposals and allocate the funding among the theme projects (maximum of €6 million per project)



## 2. Theme Proposals (2nd Call) – Call structure

### Overall Theme Project

- Serves as the conceptual and strategic framework for all sub-projects
- Defines the overall research question, focus, and approach
- Outlines the management structure, transfer strategy, and financial framework of the overall project

- Translate the overarching research question and approach into concrete work packages, milestones, and measurable outcomes
- Are designed to enable modular funding and selective implementation based on scientific merit
  - Therefore, all sub-projects must be clearly distinguishable and feasible to carry out their work independently

## 2. Theme Proposals (2nd Call) – Guidance for Applicants

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### Guidance for Applicants

- The pre-formulated questions in the templates are guidelines only. You are not required to answer all of them - they are meant to serve as orientation and support the structuring of your proposal.
- Please adhere to the page limits of the templates:
  - Overall theme project template: max. 15 pages (excl. cover, content and annex)
  - Sub-project template: max. 7 pages (excl. cover and content)



# Theme Proposals (2<sup>nd</sup> Call)

## FAQ – Frequently Asked Questions

### 3. FAQ – Theme Proposal

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#### **How can the sub-projects be modular and still fit into one overall project?**

- Sub-projects should be modular, meaning they should be designed with a high degree of autonomy. This fosters competition and ensures that scientific quality remains the central focus. At the same time, each sub-project should remain aligned with the overall theme project and contribute to the central research question.

#### **Is there a minimum number of participating Helmholtz Centers required for the sub-projects?**

- No. While the overall theme projects must involve at least three Helmholtz Centers and at least two different research fields, this requirement does not apply to the individual sub-projects.

### 3. FAQ – Funding (1/3)

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#### **Who can be funded?**

- Only Helmholtz Centers; in justified cases of indispensable expertise, a qualified university partner (within Germany) can be funded.

#### **Can industry or research institutions be funded with the INF budget?**

- No, the INF budget can only be used to fund the centers (and their university partners).
- However, the centers' 25% match can come from various funding sources, including support from external partners, e.g. universities.

### 3. FAQ – Funding (2/3)

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#### **Are overhead costs eligible for funding?**

- No, overhead costs are not funded by the Initiative and Networking Fund nor eligible as matching contributions.

#### **Do all participating centers receive their funding directly from Helmholtz?**

- No, only the lead center will receive the funds and will then distribute the funds to the partners.

#### **Is the 33% funding limit for the coordinating Helmholtz Center flexible?**

- It is a requirement for the submission of applications that no more than 33% of the total funds per Solutions Lab may be allocated to the coordinating Helmholtz Centre. This decision was made in order to strengthen cross-center collaboration and to promote healthy competition. Additionally, the €100,000 allocated for the coordinating position is on top of the project budget and does not count towards the 33% cap.

### 3. FAQ – Funding (3/3)

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#### **Theme proposals can request up to €6 million in funding – how is this possible when the total campaign budget is only €9 million?**

- The call is intentionally oversubscribed to ensure scientific excellence through competition.
- An international review panel selects the most promising projects for funding.
  - To enable selective funding, theme proposals are divided into up to six independently viable sub-projects.
  - Depending on the panel's assessment, some sub-projects may not be funded in order to ensure an effective allocation of the campaign budget.

### 3. FAQ – Matching / Co-Funding

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#### **A 25% match is required from the funded institutions. What does this mean?**

- The project partners must provide matching finances of at least 25% of the Initiative and Networking Fund.
- This means €1 million in funding + €250k in own contribution = €1250k total budget.
- Matching contributions between the partners may vary and may be allocated differently over the course of the financial years.
- Matching contributions can be provided in the form of direct costs from own funds (e.g. personnel, material, or investments) or in-kind contributions (e.g. personnel or infrastructure use).



### 3. FAQ – Submission of Proposals

#### How to submit a proposal?

- Proposals must be submitted by July 15, 2025 (11:59 pm) via the ProMeta platform:

- Proposals must be uploaded in two copies:
  - A consolidated PDF file containing the template for the overall theme project (incl. annex) and all templates for the sub-projects
  - Each sub-project template as an individual file
